#### **ACTION ALERT!**

Contact members of Executive Appropriations and tell them that there should be <u>no funding</u> set aside for the Lake Powell pipeline and the Bear River diversion project! The need for these projects must be justified, environmental reviews completed and plans of financing made public before any money should be spent.

Let your Senators and Representatives know what you think about them recommending spending over \$10 million to fight sage grouse listing and sue the federal government over RS2477 roads, states' rights, and ownership of the public lands.

## News of the Fourth Week (# 4)

HB 226 Air Quality Revisions, the bill to allow Utah to adopt standards "different" from those of the EPA passed the House. Prospects for Senate passage look fair. Other air quality bills have not fared as well - HB 295 and SB 87 failed to pass. Air quality advocates plan a press conference on Tuesday to scald the Legislature for posturing and footdragging on the issue.

You may have noticed that there are proposals to explore expanding one and creating two new state parks (Goblin Valley, Little Sahara, San Rafael Swell). Let me know what you think of these ideas so I can make our position heard!

There has been surprisingly little controversy on the water front so far (though that may change some – see What's Ahead). HB 25, which addresses a long and bitter debate over change applications, is sailing through as a broadly welcomed compromise bill. The two most contentious water bills, HB 47 and HB 108, are wedded together and will die in Rules.

Unfortunately, all of the bad and needlessly expensive Sage Brush Rebellion III bills are also on track for passage.

## **Budget News**

Week Five was a quiet week on the budget front, with no meetings of Executive Appropriations. That's about to change later this coming week, as the House and Senate Republicans begin to firm up their positions on the top priorities for funding and tax policy. All of the big ticket

issues of the Session – Healthy Utah or other Medicaid expansion options, transportation funding, and criminal justice reform remain undecided.

There will need to be some tough decisions made by Friday, including which bills that have fiscal notes will be approved, because the top budget-makers will meet with staff over the next weekend to draft the final appropriations bills for consideration in the final week.

### What's Ahead

A passel of new bad bills has emerged in the past few days to add to the workload. SB 281 sets up a fund - likely in anticipation of a last minute infusion of new one-time or ongoing appropriations - for the Lake Powell pipeline and Bear River diversion project.

HB 396 attempts to take advantage of the outcry over restricting wood burning by micromanaging the regulators.

As usual, the indefatigable Rep. Mike Noel leads the pack with hostile-to-the-environment and possibly even unconstitutional anti-federal government legislation (see HB 384, 393, 398, and 401 in the bill tracker below).

Unless things change, Standing Committees will continue to meet and hear bills throughout week 6 and even the through the last Tuesday, two days before the Session ends. This is most unusual and makes it unclear when the chambers will "wipe the boards" and send all bills back to Rules to be prioritized for floor debate (usually done on the last Friday).
