PEREGRINE WATCH 2014

A pair of peregrines has once again taken up housekeeping at the nesting box located on the northeast corner of the Joseph Smith Memorial Building in downtown Salt Lake City. Bob Walters, DWR's Watchable Wildlife Coordinator reports that the webcams are up and running. As of 3:45 p.m. on April 14th, there are three eggs in the nest. While there are no guarantees, hatching should occur sometime around May 16th or 17th. This year's brood should begin their first attempts at flight sometime around June 22nd.

"HellWeek" (Bob's term) is the 2-3 week period from the end of June to mid-July when teams of volunteers monitor the fledglings as they leave the nest and learn to fly. Bob will host a Watchable Wildlife Program field trip below the Joseph Smith Memorial Building nest box about a week in advance of the beginning of HellWeek, probably around June 17th. This field trip will also serve as training for first-time Salt Lake City Peregrine Falcon Watchpost/Rescue Team members. If you are interested in participating, keep checking the DWR Calendar at www.wildlife.utah.gov for the exact date.

In the meantime, you can tune in to the two webcams that broadcast live images of the nest, around the clock. Go to <http://wildlife.utah.gov/learn-more/peregrine-cam.html> and start watching this fascinating yearly ritual.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE JORDAN RIVER MIGRATORY BIRD RESERVE !!

Spring is in the air at the Jordan River Migratory Bird Reserve and the beneficial Beaver is helping to provide prime open water nesting habitat !

Many Canada Geese are hunkered down on feather lined ground nests next to the Beaver ponds as well as numerous pairs of Wilson's Snipe and various ducks. Widgeons, Green-winged Teal, Cinnamon Teal, and Mallards are abundantly feeding on reserve aquatic vegetation and organisms supported by the enhanced Beaver hydrology.

A Killdeer lies low on a new nest among the gravel and soils of an upland area while a young Belted Kingfisher peers from an old dead tree snag into Willow Creek for a meal of fresh fish.

Riparian plantings installed by the new Restoration Team during last fall and winter are beginning to bud and produce new sprouts and leaves. Willow sprouts along Willow Creek are spreading all along the channel creating a wider riparian corridor to support nesting and feeding resident and migratory neo-tropical birds.

With new management, Great Salt Lake Audubon is engaging in many exciting new restoration projects on the reserve which require financial assistance. We are working hard to apply for grants but also need dedicated member support.

NEWS FROM THE BEAR RIVER MIGRATORY BIRD REFUGE

Zhiwen Xu, aged 13, won Best of Show at the 2014 Utah Junior Duck Stamp Contest with her male mallard in flight created with a mixed media of prisma, airbrush, pastel, and guache. From Logan, Utah, Zhiwen's art was entered into the Federal Junior Duck Stamp Contest in Washington, D.C. where it will be judged April 18 at the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service National Conservation Training Center, Shepherdstown, W. Virginia.

The Awards Ceremony will be held at the Bear River Migratory Bird Refuge, May 10, where Zhiwen will be recognized as the one of the younger winners of the Utah Junior Duck Stamp Contest. Zhiwen has a love for wildlife and studies art with Julie Le Fevre of Sunshine Art School, Logan, Utah.

A group of keen-eyed judges representing the art world included an accomplished photographer, two wildlife artists, an expert birder, and a Federal Duck Stamp artist from Utah. Judges commented that her entry reflected a high level of attention to anatomical detail, creative expression, and use of color.

Students from kindergarten through twelfth grade are encouraged each year to enter their artistic renditions of North American waterfowl into the contest.
